A Celebration of New End Music at Christmas

As the whole school production has been changed to the end of the academic year, the school is going to hold two concerts in December. These concerts will be performed at the Heath Street Baptist Church with each class performing a song and musical performances from both the KS1 and KS2 choirs. The following days have been allocated for the different classes' involvement.

Wed, 7th December RM, 1K, 2N, 3C, 4T, 5W, 6S

Performances will start at 2.15pm.

Doors will open at 2pm.

Both downstairs and upstairs will be used. Some upstairs side seats have a restricted view, so please check with your child whether they are standing on the stage near the piano or on the other side. If you are sitting in the upstairs side seats, please sit on the opposite side to where your child will stand.

To help get in the festive mood, children are asked to wear Christmas themed jumpers / t-shirts / dresses or their brightest and best clothes for the performances. Some classes have asked for more specific colours. These are Nursery (red or black) and RM (red or green clothes or Christmas jumpers.)

The concert will run for approximately an hour and we would expect all parents to stay for the entire concert. Children in years one to six who are performing will stay and watch the concert in its entirety.

Due to the limited space outside the church and therefore safety concerns, ALL children will be walked back to school with their teachers at the end of the concerts. Parents can collect their children from the school playgrounds as normal.

A Message from Camden
