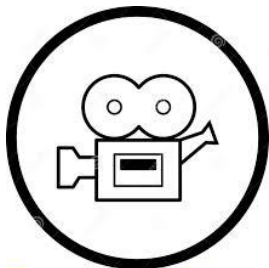


E-Safety for Parents

E-Safety Objectives (NC2014)

- * **KS1**- Use technology safely and respectfully, keeping personal information private; identify where to go for help and support when they have concerns about content or contact on the internet or other online technologies.
- * **KS2**-Use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly; recognise acceptable/unacceptable behaviour; identify a range of ways to report concerns about content and contact.
- * Communication and collaboration.

The SMART Rules

- * **S**AFE- Keep safe by being careful not to give out personal information when you're chatting or posting online. Personal information includes your email address, phone number and password.
- * **M**eeting-Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Only do so with your parents' or carers' permission and even then only when they can be present. Remember online friends are still strangers even if you have been talking to them for a long time.

The SMART rules

- * **A**ccepting- Accepting emails, IM messages, or opening files, pictures or texts from people you don't know or trust can lead to problems – they may contain viruses or nasty messages!
- * **R**eliable- Someone online might lie about who they are and information on the internet may not be true. Always check information with other websites, books or someone who knows. If you like chatting online it's best to only chat to your real world friends and family
- * **T**ell- Tell your parent, carer or a trusted adult if someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried, or if you or someone you know is being bullied online

How we teach KS2

- * Lower KS2 will refer back to the SMART rules and will look at videos like:
- * CEOP Think you Know- ‘Jigsaw’
- * Upper KS2 will start to learn about other issues such as grooming and cyberbullying.



How to keep your child safe:

- * Have the computer in a communal area so you can keep an eye on what they are doing.
- * Talk to your child about their interests and what they like to do online.
- * Create an account yourself- learn how to use it!
- * Be open...if you ban them using it....they will find another way....
