Girls Football Team reach semi-finals

Very well done to the girls football team for reaching the end of the league season undefeated in 18 games. The girls finished in third place in the Northern league, winning 7 and drawing 3 of their 10 games played. Surprisingly, this record was not quite good enough to reach the league finals automatically, but did give us a place in the play-offs for the finals qualification. In those three games, the girls beat Fitzjohns 2-0, St. Marys Kilburn 2-0 and Primrose Hill 3-2, qualifying for the league finals in first place. The league finals are for the top 8 of the 33 school teams that started out in the three Camden leagues last November. In our group games on Finals day, we beat Holy Trinity NW1 3-0, Richard Cobden 2-0 and drew with Torriano 1-1, so qualifying for the semi-finals in 2nd place (Torriano had a better goal difference). We were up against Primrose Hill again in the semi-final match and it was 1-1 after extra time, despite New End being well on top and creating numerous chances. Unfortunately, in the subsequent penalty shoot-out, we just missed out 3-2. This put us into a play-off match against Brookfield for 3rd place, which we won 1-0. So our final position in the league was 3/33. A magnificent achievement, especially as we remained throughout the season undefeated (played 18, won 13, drawn 5). Torriano were the eventual winners of the league. Well done to them and well done to all the girls in our league squad: Madison, Georgie, Teida, Lucy, Bella, Mila (all Y6); Stella, Maria (Y5). We look forward to trying again in the cup competition in June. Promoting British Values

In 2011, the government defined British Values as **democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs**. We promote these values through our own school values, curriculum and enrichment activities. Over the next five weeks we will be sharing how we promote each of these areas.

The fourth is mutual respect. We promote mutual respect at New End by:

- We have high expectations about pupil conduct and this is reflected in our Behaviour Policy and Equality Policy.
- Children are taught about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and learn to respect their rights and the rights of others.
- Through our school's values, SEAL scheme, PSHE and circle time children are taught to respect each other, to be cooperative and collaborative, be supportive and to look for similarities while being understanding of differences. The school is recognised as a Stonewall Champion.
- The SEAL theme of 'Getting on and Falling Out' explores these issues well.
- Year Five children are trained as ABC's Anti-Bullying Champions.
- Mutual respect is also promoted through additional PSHE lessons and assemblies. A range of specific assemblies were delivered focusing on helping other pupils to understand specific special needs.
- Children are taught about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and learn to respect their rights and the rights of others.
- The school has a Language of the Month to celebrate the diversity of language spoken throughout the school.
