

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## Promoting British Values

In 2011, the government defined British Values as **democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs**. We promote these values through our own school values, curriculum and enrichment activities. Over the next few weeks we will be sharing how we promote each of these areas.

The second is the rule of law. We promote the rule of law at New End by:

- We have high expectations about pupil conduct and this is reflected in our Behaviour Policy. There are rewards for exhibiting good and caring behaviour and consistent demonstration of our values is recognised through certificates and New End Stars.
- Through our school assemblies, circle time and PSHE children are taught how to earn trust and respect and are supported to develop a strong sense of morality; knowing right from wrong and doing the right thing even when it's difficult.
- Children are taught about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and learn to respect their rights and the rights of others.
- The school has agreed school rules and classes have either rules or class charters.

Attendance across the school last week was 97.51%, with an unauthorised absence level of 0.82%. Improvements again! Remember that good attendance is seen as 96% or better. Attendance to date this academic year is 96.32% with an unauthorised absence level of 0.95%. Let's keep working together to improve these figures even further! Parents and carers are reminded that any absence from school is considered an absence on your child's record.

There were 48 lates last week (4 less than the previous week) involving 34 children (7 less than the previous week) throughout the school. **A bit of an improvement this week but still a long way to go!** This week, all the children who were late last week spent the time they lost in class reading during Monday play. This will continue on a weekly basis.
